



ISI IN HOUSE COMPETITION INFORMATION

COMPETITION DATES: July 19, 2008

ENTRY FORM DEADLINE: June 19, 2008

Late entries, if accepted, will be charged double. All information must be accurate and complete. Inaccurate or incomplete entry forms will be returned. False information will result in disqualification. *The coach must sign all entry forms to verify that information is accurate.*

WAIVER:

All entries must have TSC Waiver (on reverse side of entry) signed in order for entry to be accepted. Entries without the completed and signed waiver will be considered incomplete and returned.

ELIGIBILITY:

All skaters entering the competition must be registered individual members of ISI. Skaters must compete at the highest test level they have passed, and which has been registered on or before June 19, 2008.

RULES

The competition will be conducted in accordance with the guidelines contained in the 2007 Judges Manual and with the current 2008 rule revisions, 2005 Team Standards, the 2006 ISI Skater's & Coaches Handbook with current ISI competition revisions, and the 2007/2008 US Figure Skating Rulebook.

MUSIC & REGISTRATION:

All skaters must check in at the registration desk 45 minutes prior to their scheduled event. If the competition is running ahead of schedule, events may begin earlier than the scheduled time. CDs ONLY. CD's should be turned in when checking in. CDs need to be labeled with skater's name, age, event, and rink they represent. *No more than one program per CD or cassette.* Please rewind your tapes.

AWARDS:

Awards will be presented to all competitors.

RINK SIZE:

The competition will be conducted on an NHL (85' x 200') size rink.

JUDGING

In fairness to all competitors, ALL ISI Professional members / Instructors with students competing in ISI events must judge an appropriate number of events. Please see the 2007 Judges Manual for guidelines. Only instructors who have signed up to judge will be allowed to put skaters on the ice.

ACCOUNTING REVIEW

ONLY an ISI Associate member can make an accounting review request to the Competition Director. All judge's scores are considered final! A review is only a verification of these scores. There is a \$75.00 fee for all reviews.

DESCRIPTION OF EVENTS

Tot 1 – 4: Skaters must be 5 years or under as of March 13, 2008. The one-minute routine must include moves specified in the 2006 ISI Skaters & Coaches handbook for the appropriate level and no additional moves.

Pre-Alpha – Delta: One-minute program with one additional move from Freestyle 1 required. Duration will be judged.

Freestyle 1-10: Skaters are limited to three attempts per required maneuver during their program, the best attempt will be judged.

Freestyle 3 & 4: No back spirals will be allowed during warm-up.

Pairs: Similar to Couples, but routines include pair lifts and pair spins as well.

Rhythmic Skating: Open to skaters in Freestyle 1-10 levels only. The skater chooses only one rhythmic prop per routine (ball, hoop or ribbon) and must maintain control of the prop at all times throughout the program. No additional props are permitted. Skaters must follow the maneuver limitations as for Spotlight events. Freestyle 1-4 skaters can do maneuvers from Freestyle 4 and below and Freestyle 5-10 skaters can do any skating maneuvers.

Artistic: Open to all skaters in Freestyle 1 or higher level. There are no required moves and no props allowed. Emphasis should be placed on the creative and innovative design of a skating program. *Program length is 1 ½ minutes for Artistic 1-5 and 2 minutes for Artistic 6-10.*

Spotlight Interpretive: Open to all skaters Gamma and above. Music for all levels will be 1 minute in length. Skaters may not be coached by instructors, parents, or anyone else during this event. Skaters in Freestyle 4 and below are permitted to perform single rotation jumps (single Axel and split jumps are permitted), any spins and any un-captured moves. Skaters in Freestyle 5-10 are permitted to perform single or double rotation jumps, any spins and any un-captured moves. Skaters of different genders may be grouped together. Skaters should report to the ice captain no less than 30 minutes prior to the event in order to hear the music and receive their prop prior to the warm up.

Spotlight: Props, if they are used, are limited to ones that can be hand-carried or pushed onto or off of the ice by the skater in one 30-second trip. Skaters may not be assisted with the setup, placement or removal of props. Skaters must report to registration desk to receive information concerning prop storage. Props may not be left in the lobby area and must be removed immediately after the event. Props in spotlight events are optional, but encouraged. Spotlight lighting will be used for all spotlight events. *Program length is 1 minute for Tot 1-FS 3, 1½ minutes for FS 4-5 and 2 minutes for FS 6-10.*

Spotlight Character: The skater portrays a famous, easily identifiable character, through the use of music, costume, props and actions.

Spotlight Dramatic: An artistic theatrical performance that invokes an emotional response from the judges and audience. The skater's interpretation should create a mood that is enhanced by style, creativity, costuming, and props.

Spotlight Light: The skater's program should entertain in a refreshing, lighthearted, vaudeville fashion using music, costume, props, comedy, dance, and skating moves.

Spotlight Couples: Two skaters together perform a routine that is entertaining, emotional, or a portrayal of characters using costumes and props. This event is divided into low, medium and high categories for partner selections. Groups will be divided as time warrants.

Spotlight Family: This event is open to 2 or more family members only, of any age and skating level. The prescribed program length is 1-½ minutes, and the routines may be fun, entertaining, emotional, or a portrayal of characters using costumes and props. Groups will be divided as time warrants.

Spotlight Small Group: This event is open to 2 or more skaters, of any age and skating level. The prescribed program length is 1-1/2 minutes, and the routines may be fun, entertaining, emotional, or a portrayal of characters using costumes and props. Groups will be divided as time warrants.

Open Freestyle: Skater must be an ISI Member, though no ISI Testing is required. Skaters will be scored on jumps, spins, connecting moves, and presentation.

NO TEST COMETS– Duration 1:30 Toe Loop/Salchow, no Axel, no jump spins.

NO TEST STARS - Duration 1:30 Flip/Loop/Lutz, no Axel, no jump spins.

PRE PRELIMINARY See the guidelines for a well-balanced program in the current USFS rulebook.

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TEST MANEUVERS:

Each maneuver will be performed twice. The best attempt will be judged. Skaters must enter at or one level above their current test level. Skaters may enter up to two different levels. The required maneuvers are listed below.

TOTS:	Dip
PRE ALPHA:	Forward Swizzles
ALPHA:	Forward Crossovers – left over right
BETA:	Backward Crossovers – right over left
GAMMA:	Left Forward Outside Three Turn
DELTA:	Bunny Hop
FS 1:	Waltz Jump
FS 2:	One-Foot Spin
FS 3:	Salchow
FS 4:	Flip Jump
FS 5:	Axel

SOLO COMPULSORY:

Moves can be performed *in any order* in a one-minute pre-choreographed routine with no music, and with a minimal amount of connecting moves. Full ice will be used for all levels.

TOT 1: Proper Way To Fall/ Proper Way To Get Up/ Marching While Standing

TOT 2: Forward Swizzle Standing Still/ 2 Foot Hop In Place/Single Swizzle

TOT 3: Preparation For Snowplow Stop/ Forward Swizzle/ Dip

TOT 4: Backward Wiggle/ Backward Swizzles (3) / Two Foot Snowplow Stop

PRE ALPHA: Forward Swizzles/ 2 Foot Glide (either foot)/ Backward Wiggles

ALPHA: Forward Stroking/ Forward Crossovers (right over left)/ 1 Foot Snowplow Stop (either foot)

BETA: Backward Stroking/ Backward Crossovers (left over right)/ T stop (either foot)

GAMMA: Mohawk Combination (either foot)/ Hockey Stop/ Right Forward Outside Three Turn

DELTA: Forward Outside Edges (4)/ Bunny Hop/ Lunge

FREESTYLE 1: ½ Flip/ Waltz Jump/ 2-Foot Spin

FREESTYLE 2: ½ Lutz/ 1 Foot Spin/ Ballet Jump

FREESTYLE 3: Toe Loop/ Backward Pivot/ Salchow

FREESTYLE 4: Flip Jump/ Sit Spin/ Loop Jump

FREESTYLE 5: Lutz/ Back Spin/ Axel
